Since becoming Chair to the Liaison Committee in January 2025, I have worked to expand APPNA's national and global influence by reaching out to organizations for APPNA in order to enhance its visibility and expand its platform in advocacy, policymaking, research, and academics.



American Medical Association (AMA) – February 2025

A milestone was set on February 20, 2025 as I facilitated a successful meeting between the Liaison Committee and AMA executives, with strong APPNA attendance, including myself, Liaison Committee members, President APPNA Dr. Humeraa Qamar, Secretory Dr. Mohammed Sanaullah , Treasurer Dr. Furrukh Malik, COM Nicholas Suh, and PM Leslye Montero.

The meeting discussed a possible alliance with AMA to unite a broader physicians community and strengthen our organizations in advancing meaningful medical reforms for the benefit of our physicians and patients.

I have negotiated a favorable incentive from AMA for APPNA to join the Specialty and Service Society (SSS) in 2025--a key step in toward membership in AMA's House of Delegates (HOD), our overarching goal for greater success.

Currently, we are initiating data forensics for APPNA and AMA. Once completed, we will proceed with advancing the alliance with AMA and becoming a member of HOD.



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Middle East, North African, South Asian (MENASA) Group – February 2025

Our committee has also been working with Dr. Hadi Danawi, director MENASA, to strengthen APPNA's role in academics and research. MENASA Group promotes inclusivity and equity in healthcare by supporting non-traditional people of color and healthcare professionals in these fields. This collaboration will enhance the representation of HCPs from MENASA and APPNA in research, clinical trials, and investigational products.

This collaboration was further initiated once APPNA had established an MOU with MENASA on February 24, 2025. The MOU acknowledges support for a shared vision for inclusion and diversity in academics and research.

On February 27, 2025, the Liaison Committee held a meeting with MENASA Group's Director: Hadi Danawi.

The MENASA Summit is on April 19, 2025 in Houston TX. I encourage APPNA members to attend to support APPNA.

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APPNA YPC COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORT

Dear YPC team members.

I welcome you all to the YPC team 2025! Like every year, this year the YPC comprises of extremely dedicated and selfless team of volunteer physicians that include some senior members, newly become APPNA members, YPC members from previous years and some young members who are very early in the career! Our team includes faculties, residency and fellowship programs leadership, very well established and successful private practitioners, fellows and residents! We also have quite a diverse Committee with members from all across Pakistan and also from "smaller alumni."

The goal of the APPNA YPC traditionally was limited to focusing on the needs of Pakistani applicants looking to get into residency in the US. Our primary focus will remain around that area, however we have expanded way beyond that last year and we did it very successfully so we will push this year even further!

There was a sizeable increase in the number of Pakistani physicians matched last year. Approximately 700 plus Pakistanis matched in 2024 and more than 50% of them were directly helped in some way by YPC. More or less 5000 new members were added to APPNA YPC Facebook group last year. So with the growing numbers of applicants every year, we need an extremely dedicated team of volunteer members and mentors to cope up with the demand.

We will continue to work on the sub committees model created last year and expand on previously started projects and initiate new ones. This year, the Visa advocacy will be under YPC, which traditionally has been under Advocacy Committee. All the subcommittees will function collectively to help and assist our younger generation of Pakistani descent in physicians. Following are some sub committees and tasks that we will try to accomplish this year:

- YPC Social media subcommittee will manage FB page and will try to stay active and answer the questions frequently asked, to the best of their knowledge. We will expand on Twitter (X), Promote YouTube channel, webinars and create more content that can attract online audience.
- Webinars subcommittee will continue the same theme and topics of webinars and expand more topics and collaboration! We will do webinars of two different types: the usual Residency and match related topics and other will be under Early Careerist subcommittee.

- **SPRING 2025 EDITION**
- Observership subcommittee- 4 quarterly cycles for observership applications will be announced. First one will pe posted in few weeks. We have highest demand and lowest possible numbers of preceptors, so we desperately need more preceptors.
- In person YPC seminars in ALL APPNA MEETINGS. The sessions may include PDs session, alternate career pathways, resident Boot camp, early careerist, financial awareness etc. Research and poster presentations has already been announced for Spring meeting in Oklahoma and we also aim to continue at summer (Dallas) and winter meetings (Lahore).
- More Collaboration with ECFMG, USMLE and FSMB. Invite for in person session at summer meeting
- APPNA YPC Research Travel Awards.
- Mentorship and Mock interview subcommittee; will try assign every applicant a mentor early this year who can help the candidates review their CV/PS and then conduct mock interviews during application season. We will target to help 1200 applicants this year (last year were 850). Will start Mentor request form very early this year and aim at getting 400 plus mentors (always better to aim high)
- Subcommittee for Residents and Fellows may combine with Early Careerist Subcommittee- Help residents and fellows acclimatize to their training programs (boot camp/ webinars before start of their training). Mentor them for research and leadership roles. Job search, contract negotiations and financial awareness. This subcommittee and early career subcommittee may be combined as there is some overlap.
- Visa Advocacy and other Visa issues- will be under YPC this year. We will collect all the data under YPC umbrella and publish official report of matched candidates
- Match applicants WhatsApp mentorship groups under YPC umbrella- will encourage all members to join and replies to the queries of current match applicants.
- US based Students mentorship subcommittee focus on high school and college students, mentoring them for admissions in medical school. More collaboration needed from NAMA.
- APPNA YPC loan subcommittee will work in collaboration with another US based organization called ACC (A Continuous Charity). \$30,000 approved and plan to generate more funds into this program. An additional \$200,000 will be invested and returns will be utilized for loan.
- Membership drive- invite young physicians to become members

APPNA is known for its humanitarian efforts, including disaster relief and community support. APPNA played a crucial role in providing food supplies and counseling to families affected by the Los Angeles wildfires. President APPNA Dr. Humeraa Qamar, President Elect Dr. Babar Rao and the Board of directors immediately released 10K for the victims of LA wildfires.

APPNA's Relief Efforts for LA Wildfire Victims

- Food Distribution
- Supplied essential food packages and necessities to displaced families.
- Partnered with ICNA (Islamic Circle of North America) to ensure affected individuals received meals.
- Organized community kitchen services for hot meal distribution.
- Counseling & Emotional Support
- Mobilized APPNA mental health professionals to offer emotional support and counseling to cope with trauma and loss
- Assisted families in navigating post-disaster challenges, such as housing and medical care.

APPNA's holistic approach ensures both physical and emotional recovery for those impacted by wildfires. Now with the Jan. 2025 wildfires in Southern California fully contained, rebuilding efforts are underway as residents return to the Palisades and Eaton burn areas. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency crews continue working to

identify and remove hazardous waste from properties scorched by the fires. As the rebuilding process continues, we aim to continue to help our adopted homeland during this time of need.

APPNA MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORT

SOPHIA JANJUA, MD



Over the last decade, APPNA membership has hovered around 2500 members. Pakistani physicians are America's third largest source of foreign trained physicians (India being first followed by Philippines). There are over 15,000 physicians of Pakistani descent in the US, but only a third are APPNA members.

At the beginning of the year, only lifetime members are active in the APPNA database, as all other membership categories expire on December 31st. That said, in 2024, the year started with 2496 lifetime members.

Following are the numbers of each membership category that was approved in 2024.

336 Student
369 Physicians in training
124 Lifetime members
12 Emeritus members
106 Associate
1422 Annual members
19 Affiliate members

Altogether, 2388 new members were made across all categories in 2024 – which brought membership to 4884 members (2496+2388).

2025 year has started with 2620 members (2496 + 124). Membership Cmte 2025is focused on increasing APPNA membership. In keeping with APPNA byelaws, Membership cmte recommends decreasing both annual and lifetime dues for 2025.

Section 5 of the APPNA by -laws regarding Annual dues state "Shall be determined by majority vote of BOD and approved by majority of the Council". Term of annual dues shall be the calendar year.

Section 2, Clause 1 (f) of APPNA by-laws also go on to state "Any active member of the Association, on payment of fifteen (15) years of current annual dues paid in total or in installments or making full payment within

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Based upon these bylaws, MC 2025 recommends the following for the year 2025:

one year may apply for Lifetime membership in the Association."

1. Reduction in both annual dues and Lifetime dues

Annual dues: \$65.00

Lifetime dues: \$975. (is a multiplier of 15)

Membership committee is confident that by reducing our membership dues, we would double our membership. The goal would be to make NEW annual members and lifetime members.

- 2. Sending automatic renewals MC recommends sending automatic renewals to all annual dues paying membership. MC recommends that verification of annual members be done every 2-3 years.
- 3. Amend the bylaws to be more inclusive.

Our goal is to increase our membership – we can double our membership and make it representative of the Pakistani physician diaspora. We hope Board of Directors (BOD) will approve these recommendations so MC 2025 can implement them by the spring meeting in Oklahoma.

APPNA RESA COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORT - SWOT ANALYSIS FOR 2025

DANISH BHATTI, MD



On behalf of the APPNA RESA Committee, I am pleased to submit the APPNA RESA Committee SWOT Analysis 2025 for publication. This analysis evaluates our continuing medical education (CME) initiatives, highlights achievements, identifies challenges, and outlines strategic growth opportunities for expanding research and academic engagement within the Pakistani medical diaspora in North America.

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The APPNA RESA Committee has successfully completed ACCME re-certification for four years, formalized CME program guidelines, and built a strong network of APPNA

members actively participating in our programs. However, key challenges remain, including part-time CME coordinators, lack of structured training for CME directors, gaps in policy documentation, and limited research support for residents, fellows, and junior faculty. Additionally, high CME costs hinder accessibility for trainees.

To address these challenges, we aim to expand specialty-focused CME programs in Cardiology, Gastroenterology, Hematology-Oncology, Psychiatry, and Dentistry and integrate Artificial Intelligence (AI) in CME sessions. Further, we seek to engage APPNA's academic members, develop faculty mentorship programs, introduce diverse CME formats such as online courses and workshops, and build a faculty database to facilitate research and networking.

External challenges include new ACCME regulations limiting scheduling flexibility, retention issues for key coordinators, and increased competition from other CME providers. Additionally, our reliance on a non-academic CME partner (AmedCo) instead of a university or state medical society requires reevaluation.

Despite these challenges, APPNA RESA remains committed to enhancing CME accessibility, strengthening research support, and ensuring that APPNA remains a leader in medical education. We aim to create a more structured, innovative, and inclusive platform for Pakistani-origin healthcare professionals by implementing these strategic initiatives.

We appreciate your consideration of this submission and look forward to your feedback. Please let us know if further refinements are needed.

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NAVIGATING LEADERSHIP: INSIGHTS FROM APPNA STRATEGY MEETING 2025 NAUMAN ASHRAF, MD



The leadership sessions at the APPNA Strategy Meeting 2025 left a lasting impression on me. They illuminated many facets of effective leadership. Topics discussed included emotional intelligence, conflict of interest, the importance of influence, and the concept of dedicating 10,000 hours to achieve mastery.

Dr. Humeraa Qamar opened the leadership session with her presidential address and emphasized on the importance of accountability and transparency. Accountability and transparency are crucial in leadership as they foster trust and integrity within an organization. Leaders who are accountable take responsibility for their actions and decisions, while transparency ensures that these actions are visible and understandable to

all stakeholders.

Dr. Hala Sabry, founder of the Physician Moms Group (PMG) and a Board-Certified Emergency Medicine physician, emphasized the importance of being influential in her talk. She outlined six key points for effective mentorship and leadership: modeling desired behavior, giving meaningful and actionable feedback, investing in mentees' growth, setting and inspiring a clear vision, being decisive and taking ownership, and communicating with clarity and confidence. She highlighted that embodying these principles can significantly enhance productivity and shape a brighter future. Additionally, she discussed emotional intelligence, which involves self-awareness, self-regulation, motivation, empathy, and social skills. Leaders with high emotional intelligence are better equipped to handle stress, resolve conflicts, and inspire their teams. They create a positive work environment where team members feel valued and understood, leading to higher morale and productivity.

Dr. Babar Rao, APPNA's President Elect shared his personal journey and the driving forces behind his success in life. He emphasized that vulnerability is crucial for leadership as it builds trust, fosters genuine connections, and promotes innovation. Admitting mistakes and seeking feedback encourages growth and strengthens resilience. Ultimately, it creates a supportive, high-performing work environment.

Dr. Muhammad Sanaullah, APPNA's Secretary, spoke about the importance of managing conflicts of interest. When a leader's personal interests clash with their professional responsibilities, effective leaders address these

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conflicts transparently, prioritize the organization's interests, and maintain objectivity. Prompt and ethical conflict resolution preserves trust and prevents potential damage to the organization's reputation.

Dr. Furrukh Malik, APPNA's Treasurer, shared the story of Flight 1549 and Captain Chesley Sullenberger, famous for the Miracle on the Hudson landing. Dr. Malik emphasized that "Miracles only happen for the well-prepared" and "Individual leadership before Leadership." He underscored the importance of the concept of putting in 10,000 hours to achieve mastery, as popularized by Malcolm Gladwell in his book "Outliers." This idea suggests that expertise requires approximately 10,000 hours of deliberate practice. For leaders, this means continuously honing their skills, seeking new challenges, and learning from both successes and failures.

Dr. Mujtaba Qazi and Dr. Arman Raza conducted an interactive leadership case series emphasizing the significance of a team-oriented mindset and the value of mentorship. They underscored that while having innovative ideas and passion is essential, it is equally important to cultivate team-building skills and foster consensus to successfully achieve desired outcomes.

In conclusion, the strategy meeting provided a comprehensive overview of the key components of effective leadership. Emotional intelligence, the ethical management of conflicts of interest, the significance of mentoring, and the dedication to mastering one's craft are all vital elements that contribute to successful leadership. By embracing these principles, leaders can navigate the complexities of their roles and inspire their teams to achieve greatness.





































