

Saturday night will be graced with flavorful food, complemented with the soothing, heartwarming voices of Tahseen Javed and Nadeem Abbas Lunewala.


Grand finale of the meeting on Sunday will comprise of Halwa Puri breakfast while watching India-Pakistan cricket match.

Secretary's Message



It is my pleasure and honor to welcome you to the 2021 Fall Meeting.

APPNA is at a crossroads. Stability has been achieved over the last twenty-two months, leaving behind the turmoil of the preceding few years. Now it must decide about its future direction. It can take-off from here as a vibrant, forward-looking organization or continue with the status-quo; continue being frozen-in-time.

As an organization, some serious soul searching is in order. It is a matter of immense concern that we have not been able to bring younger membership into the folds of the organization in decent numbers.

The membership comprises less than ten percent of those that graduated from medical schools in the year 2000 or later. Only two hundred and fifty-eight members

out of close to three thousand total membership are those that graduated from medical schools in the last twenty years!

I believe that one of the major reasons that we have been failing to attract the younger generations is that we have failed to define the purpose, the *raison d'etre* of APPNA.

APPNA must define itself. What are we? What do we strive to accomplish? If APPNA is just to be a small-scale charity organization, it will not prosper. If charity is the whole reason of existence for APPNA, there are much bigger charity organizations. We have seen younger folks moving in droves to those.

We are the largest organization of professional Pakistani diaspora anywhere in the world. We must not let ourselves be content with small-scale charity and holding a few meetings a year. We must think big, we must act big.

A vibrant organization must concern itself with problems facing its membership. It must try to be proactive on issues. APPNA is multi-dimensional. It has the potential to lead not only the physicians of Pakistani descent but the wider Pakistani diaspora in North America.

We have examples of APPNA making a real difference in the past. We remain proud and grateful that it was the efforts and leadership of APPNA that thwarted the attempt to give a a separate designation, a designation different than 'MD', to foreign medical graduates.

We must involve ourselves with trying and influencing policy in Pakistan. Charity must continue but it can only help so many. APPNA must try to bring about changes that will help the country as a whole. Our expertise is medical education, training, and healthcare governance. We must give our input where our expertise lies.

APPNA must seriously look at its finances. It is sad that even after forty years, we continue to be reliant solely on revenues from membership dues and meetings. We must try to explore other permanent sources of revenue such as investing in healthcare facilities.

In my humble opinion, APPNA must seriously explore the prospects of establishing a state-of-the-art APPNA hospital and medical school in Pakistan. An APPNA healthcare and education system would sure become the standard bearer of quality medical care and education in Pakistan. Besides, it would also help bring in significant revenues for the organization on a permanent basis.

Once APPNA chooses an ascendant path for itself, once it gets out of its comfort bubble and set higher goals for itself, it will start to prosper and grow again. It is destined to lead and succeed; it must not remain complacent.

Treasurer's Message



Dear APPNA members

It is my unique privilege and honor as Appna's treasurer to be presenting this report for the first 9 months of 2021.

Ever since taking office on January 1 2021, I have been busy learning the finances of APPNA including its various accounts, wether operational or investment, including but not limited to component societies, Social Welfare Disaster Relief committee and the various other accounts. This learning process has been time consuming but very gratifying and educational for me.

I prepared and presented the first operational budget of 2021 encompassing the first six months, to the APPNA COUNCIL, on February 10th 2021 which was

unanimously approved by the Council, a source of great personal satisfaction for me (a rare occurrence in Appna's history). That budget is available on APPNA's password protected website for members' perusal. I have worked diligently with the APPNA's financial advisor to get their management fee decreased on the APPNA lifetime dues investment fund, saving APPNA about \$14,000 annually.

I worked hard to revise the Financial Policy of APPNA with the Finance committee members' help, a momentous and long overdue task. This financial policy delineates the role of APPNA treasurer and other financial advisers in a very clear and concise manner. A provision was made in the financial policy to divert some of the surplus monies to an emergency fund for APPNA's operational expenses to be requested by the Treasurer and approved by the Council. Again that financial policy has been uploaded to APPNA's website in a prompt fashion.

APPNA's yearly operational expenses are typically dependent upon the money collected during APPNA's meetings and international trips, which in a typical year can be in the tune of \$300,000 to \$400,000.

2019 was a slow year for meetings' financial collections, for reasons which are beyond the scope of this report. 2020 was a complete washout for meetings' income because of the Covid Pandemic swallowing all the meetings and international trips. This left APPNA in a tight spot for the operational expenses only. Hence I devised a successful online E BAZAR and E CLASSIFIED for the APPNA website which will generate ongoing income for APPNA's operational expenses and also provide service to our members in which they can shop online and also post and pursue job openings and or sales of practices or medical equipment. This E bazaar is operational now and I would urge all of you to please avail of this wonderful opportunity and hence help APPNA also.

In addition to being on top of APPNA's finances, I have played the role of legislation and advocacy, with the rest of the EC, in an extremely diligent, professional and cordial manner, always putting the interest of APPNA first. This included working cohesively with the CABL committee and the other EC members to help fine tune and pass the new CABL which passed by a unanimous vote by the APPNA council in another historic vote on June 1st 2021. This new CABL includes an anti Harassment clause encompassing in person or social media harassment.

Going forward I will be continuing to take my responsibilities very seriously to focus on APPNA's financial health, including budget accountability in a transparent fashion and keeping a tab on all expenses and income and keeping up with all legislative and day to day running of the organization in a professional and fair manner, free of all special interest groups.

I am so excited for our upcoming in-person 2021 APPNA Fall Meeting, Dallas.



APPNA SWDRC & COVID Taskforce Efforts

Dear APPNA Family,

APPNA SWDRC and COVID Taskforce continued to work together this year also to raise funds and coordinate the various projects.

There was severe winter weather in both Pakistan and USA in the beginning of the year. For Pakistan, around 20,000 dollars were raised to distribute warm clothes and blankets in Punjab, KPK, Balochistan and Azad Kashmir through CDRS and even Karachi area was affected so warm clothes were distributed through Khana Gher.

During the clothes distribution, it was seen that there is a huge need to provide shoes to children and many had never owned a pair of shoes. Donors supported this

Children shoe project and funds were matched and these were provided in many major cities as well as small towns in Pakistan. The pictures were extremely moving and many people took part in this project and 20,000 dollars were raised.

In USA, the winter storm in Texas created havoc and APPNA raised 10,000 dollars and in collaboration with ICNA Relief, 600 hot meals were provided daily for a week to homeless and refugees staying in the Dallas Convention Center. Funds were also matched and provided to the Oklahoma APPNA chapter as that was another state that suffered.

APPNA has also worked with ICNA Relief through its various chapters and members for not only distribution of food, but also the APPNA/ICNA mobile clinics have been used for health fairs, COVID / Flue vaccinations, screening of diabetes and hypertension and many other conditions. Cities like Dallas, New York City, Chicago, Orlando and DMV area have held many successful health fairs.

With the start of Ramadan, several food distributions were done in collaboration with Saylani Trust, Khana Gher, Al Khidmat, Helping Hands, Shahid Afridi Foundation and CDRS. Hot meals for iftar and Sehri were provided along with food rations distribution in every province in Pakistan. In USA, many food pantries ration distribution was sponsored by APPNA members and funds were matched by APPNA. ICNA Relief played a major role in not only distributing food but also organizing health fairs and providing COVID vaccination. APPNA matched 50 cents to a dollar for food packages, members and chapters donated generously for food distribution. We will continue to match funds for food distribution through the year.





During Ramadan, Pakistan had another COVID surge and there was a big need for oxygen cylinders. APPNA has been working with Alkhidmat Foundation since last year for providing oxygen cylinders to the deserving patients and 600 oxygen cylinders have been provided so far. We are very grateful to the many generous donors who contributed.



Dr Abdul Majeed is leading the APPNA Thar water project. We are collaborating with Akhuwat Pakistan and solar energy is being utilized to build water wells and pumps. Dr Majeed has annually raised 70-80,000 dollars to fund this project.

The APPNA cornea project, started in 2017 by Dr Fawad Zafar, and over 4000 corneas since then have been sent to Pakistan. Last year, due to pandemic, sending corneas was a challenge but over the past 3 months, corneas are again now being sent to Pakistan. The cost of each cornea is 250 dollars and many patients have benefited from this.

APPNA is also helping our alumni in providing medical equipment to their hospitals and both KE alumni and SMC alumni raised funds to provide 21 ICU beds to Mayo Hospital and other hospitals in Karachi and was a big help for the COVID patients.

This year APPNA has started Kachra Kundi school scholarship project in Karachi, Dr. Shahid Yousuf is leading this project. There are many schools run by an NGO in various poor neighborhoods of Karachi. Many brilliant students from these schools are going for higher studies but need financial support. We have started this project with \$15-20k per year from an anonymous APPNA donor but potentially can be increased depending upon the interest of our donors.

Louisiana was badly hit by Hurricane Ida in September, APPNA in collaboration with ICNA Relief participated in the relief efforts. APPNA/ICNA mobile clinic set up many medical camps in various towns as well as good and supplies were distributed to affected people. APPNA members Drs Mohammad Suleman, Majid Nazim, Kaleem Arshad and many others volunteered for medical camps and provided much needed healthcare services.

Afghan refugees started arriving in USA after withdrawal of US forces from Afghanistan. APPNA is collaborating with ICNEA Relief to support Afghan families residing in various cities. Your support is much needed in order to help them settle in USA.

Baluchistan earthquake caused damage in Hernai district of Baluchistan in October. Again SWDRC acted promptly, about 250-300 houses are damaged, need assessment is in progress via our partners on the ground and appropriate help will be provided to the affected families.

APPNA MERIT (Medical Education, Research and Information and Technology Transfer) Committee founded in 2006 has been tasked to help improve its namesake targets in Pakistan through institutional collaborations, working with local societies and creating resources useful nationally. Since then we have grown to a 75+ member committee with 15 specific sub-committees running individual projects introducing modern methods of blended and online learning using Learning Management System educating over 6000 Pakistani Physicians in collaboration with 27+ institutions and various local societies. We have offered 150+ CME hours of education in 2020 and have already crossed 150 CME hours for 2021. This year our focus has been Healthcare Research and Innovation in Pakistan including Physician

In our efforts for sustainable education through development of Enduring Material and short courses we have launched APPNA Academy (appnaacademy.com) our online LMS system. We currently have 13 courses launched online including Fundamentals of Critical Care Nursing, Point of Care Ultrasound, Mini-Fellowship in Stroke, Mini-fellowship in Movement Disorders, Neurological Examination and Family Practice Rotation in Cardiology, Neurology, Pediatrics, Emergency Medicine and Psychiatry and will soon be launching Certificate courses on Online Medical Education. We intend to continue to grow our portfolio of courses over time.

The need for enhancing the primary care in Pakistan has been acutely recognized and we have focused on helping bridge the knowledge and skills gap in practicing General Practitioners in Pakistan through a one-year long course called APPNA MERIT Family Practice Specialty Rotations in collaboration with multiple partners. With our focus on Healthcare Research and Innovation in Pakistan this year we have started a Series of webinar to explore the landscape with top leadership and innovators from Pakistan including National Institute of Health, Higher Education Commission of Pakistan, Biotechnology and Artificial Intelligence etc. Similarly we are running multiple other specialty topics webinar series. We completed a 50 webinar series on Covid last year and are currently running Webinars in Nephrology, Emergency Medicine, HIV and Critical Care Nursing. Many of these webinars recordings are on our YouTube channel that currently has 152 published videos so far with total of 20000+ views and 1000+ subscribers.

I am very thankful to our 400+ faculty of speakers and panelists from various sub-specialities that has helped us develop and present these programs. 
We collaborated with the ICNA and these health fairs were held at Turkish mosque Diyaanet center and Laurel Mosque in Maryland.




