We have gone above and beyond to create a culture of civility, respect and tolerance at APPNA. As your immediate past President, my emphasis has always been team work and bringing all parties to the table. It has been an excellent experience working with Board members, APPNA council and regular interactions with our amazing members.

As we are almost in the middle of Dr. Arshad Rehan Presidency, it is heartening to see the continued growth and success of APPNA.

I stand shoulder to shoulder with him and will always be there to support Arshad, who is doing a great job in taking APPNA to new heights.

My year as President was first year under new bylaws. Transition was not easy but with the unwavering help and support of all of you, we made it. Last year as I worked diligently on creating a positive and productive culture in APPNA, I remained equally focused on institution building.

I am very humbled and proud to share that in the year 2022, APPNA has been most profitable with record breaking income and profits. This is a testament to the interest and trust APPNA gained from its membership.

Close to my heart are few projects, of which opening an APPNA office in Pakistan and registering as an NGO is the top priority. I am happy to report that APPNA office was recently inaugurated in Rawalpindi Medical College Campus by Dr Arshad Rehan couple of weeks ago . The process of registering as an NGO is on going.

Some of the financial details and planning.

- APPNA have earmarked 50 K from last years profit to hire an expert in grant writing. Search for suitable candidate ongoing.

- As immediate past President, 205K was left in restricted account for investment in real estate for additional income to APPNA.

- \$250 K from last year profits for home building for flood victims in Pakistan. Total amount



for home building (appr 500 homes) for flood victims is over a Million dollars, rest raised by Social Welfare and Disaster Relief Committee. I am happy to report that majority of the houses have been built and handed over to victims. This phase will end in next couple of months.

At the core of our organization vision is charity work. I am extremely proud to share the achievements of SWDRC. APPNA SWDRC has been very busy during 2022. COVID-19 Pandemic relief work continued in 2022, provided over \$150k worth of food supplies in USA and Pakistan, total reaching \$2M since start of pandemic, including Food/ration packs to deserving families, PPE supplies to healthcare professionals, home O2 cylinder supplies to sick patients requiring supplemental Oxygen in various cities across the country.

APPNA SWDRC immediately started relief efforts for families affected by one if the worst flooding in the history of Pakistan. Over \$250k worth of cooked hot meals, ration/food packs, medicines, mosquito nets, hygiene kits, blankets and other needed supplies were provided in flood affected areas of Sindh, Baluchistan, South Punjab and KPK. In rehabilitation phase, over \$1Million is being spent to build 500 homes for flood affected families across the country including Sindh, Baluchistan, South Punjab, KPK and Gilgit including an entire Hindu village which was wiped out by floods in Sind, in collaboration with Custom healthcare society and HDF. I really appreciate the generous support of our donors which includes individual members, some of our chapters and Alumni associations.

APPNA success in our academic, healthcare, diplomatic and social work domains is purely due to dedication of our team.

As I step back from my role, I feel content knowing that APPNA is in really in good hands. Dr. Arshad Rehan as President of 2023 and Dr. Asif Mohiuddin as President elect of 2023, will take APPNA to new heights. I will stand shoulder to shoulder with them for any help they might need.

## **APPNA Advocacy Committee**



Respected APPNA members,

As chair of the advocacy committee, APPNA , I would like to share some excellent news.

This year we have the maximum number of residents matched in various residency programs in the USA . Approximately ( those who provided their info to APPNA ) 586 residents matched. This is maximum number of Pakistani graduates, matched in a year.

This could not have been achieved without the ongoing efforts of the Advocacy committee , chaired by my predecessor, Dr. Piracha and his team over the last 3 years and team of APPNA YPC, chaired by Dr. Nauman Ashraf, providing guidance to our young physicians all year long.

I would like to personally mention and thank Dr. Fateh Shahzad who has been part of the Advocacy committee and YPC for numerous years . He works tirelessly providing guidance to students and young physicians of Pakistan on all their issues ,including reviewing their visa applications, preparing them with visa interviews and establishing WhatsApp group before residency match. .After the match result is announced, another WhatsApp group is established, of matched residents and help is

provided on visa processing.

Due to these efforts of APPNA YPC and Advocacy committee , the number of matched residents from Pakistan has doubled in 3 years.

Encouraging news is that almost half residents are females and our graduates have matched in General surgery , Neurosurgery , Vascular surgery , Interventional Radiology and Emergency Department.

The following statistics are gathered by Dr. Fateh Shahzad and his team.

Total residents matched : 586 Males: 301 Females: 285 Most of them are visa requiring residents J-1 visa requiring 419 H-1 visa requiring 135 Non visa requiring 32





USA embassy in Islamabad and consulate in Karachi were provided with the names and details of all visas requiring residents to secure visa interview slots, as normal waiting time for visa interview is over 1 year. Embassy and consulate positively responded and provided visa interview slots in April , May and June.

More than 40% residents qualified for visa interview waiver and got their passports with visa stamped within 7-10 days after submitting their paperwork.

We have 3 cases of administrative processing, and one of these 3 cases has already cleared the administrative processing and only 2 cases pending at the time this report is prepared. We are very hopeful all of the residents will join their residency programs on time In Sha Allah.

I would like to thank her excellency Ambassador Anne Paterson who has been pivotal in our communications with honorable USA ambassador to Pakistan Donald Blome regarding opening of visa interview slots and expediting the visa stamping processes to avoid unnecessary delays.



Advocacy committee also played an integral role along with his Excellency Ambassador Masood Khan in facilitating the communications with office of the Turkish Ambassador for a successful APPNA fund raising zoom call, in aid of devastation caused by huge earthquake in Turkey.

## **APPNA Scholarship Committee**



Dear APPNA family,

It gives me great pleasure to present the report of APPNA scholarship committee. As many of you know that the Alumni Scholarship Project was established after a generous matching donation of over one million dollars from one of the Nishtar Alumni of North America towards Alumni Scholarship Program. Since inception of scholarship program the funds have grown more than \$ 3 million.

The mission of the committee is to provide scholarships to deserving medical students who do not have the means to continue their education and follow their dreams due to financial hardship. The vision of the committee is to promote excellence in the medical field by ensuring that no one is left behind just because he/she does not have the means and create a sense of generosity and desire to give to everyone.

Among others, the one of the goals of Scholarship Program is to help deserving students enrolled at their respective medical colleges in Pakistan to defray some of their educational expenses so they can continue their medical education. The money is distributed from the appreciation and income of invested funds. Each Alumni selects the students from their universities based on certain set criteria, such as the financial health of the family, the students grades and willingness to help others after graduation.

Currently there are nine medical universities alumni participating in this program and total assets are over \$3 million. Last year hundreds of scholarships were granted to their respective Alumni students and Nishtar medical university alumni granted scholarship to 55 students.

Lastly, the APPNA scholarship committee requests all the Alumni members to donate generously to their Alumni scholarship funds, so that this mission continues.










### **APPNA Spring Meeting 2023**

#### Nishtar Alumni Association of North America



Representing Nishtar Alumni of North America as President this year is an honor. We are very blessed to have such a vibrant group of alumni members who are not only generous donors but also very supportive of young leadership. I do believe that this year our EC is composed of the youngest members among all other alumni associations.

Every year executive council sets new goals and meets most of those goals. Our goal is to accomplish four projects this year.

1. Completion of the Gastroenterology Project, which we started many years ago, where we upgraded the gastroenterology department in Nishtar with

multiple endoscopes and ERCP equipment, and now the plan is to provide EUS Setup, which will cost around US\$330,000. Funds are already Collected.

2. We are currently renovating a dedicated reading room/library in one of the hotels in Nishtar, which will provide a comfortable reading environment for USMLE aspirants.

3. We will Upgrade the IT lab in Nishtar, which will help change the traditional paper-based exam system to IT-based exams. The plan is to renovate the previous IT lab and add 110 computer stations.

4. Renovation/Upgradation of ICU and provide essential equipment like BiPAP/CPAP/flexible bronchoscopy/bedside ultrasound and other life-saving equipment. This project will cost us around \$100,000.

We are also working on completing the Nishtar Foundation for the smooth transfer of funds from Nana to the Nishtar Foundation in Pakistan. One of her senior members is actively working on that. Hopefully will have this foundation completed by the end of this year.

Nishtar Alumni has the most extensive loan program with funds up to \$1.3 million. It Helps more than four dozen students per class through their five years of education.

NANA YPC is arranging for Dozens of observer ships for students and has a great mentorship program.



US MD graduates and 91.6% for US DO graduates, which is steady. IMG US citizens matching rate was 67.5%, which is an increase of 6.2%.

A majority of these US IMG graduates are from Caribbean medical schools. Alumni of Caribbean medical schools along with NAMA can provide the growth needed to increase membership. There are other factors which are being debated to increase membership including annual membership fee and streamlining the various memberships including Local chapters and Alumni dues.

Other accomplishments that APPNA achieved were to settle the lawsuits and now have healthy reserves to conduct its day to day business.

APPNA as a professional organization is here to stay and represent all doctors of Pakistani descent by increasing its members and diversifying its base to attract graduates not only from Pakistan but from US and the Caribbean.

#### How To Make Money In Real Estate Value added opportunities?

Also known as value-oriented real estate, value-add real estate is any commercial property with existing income but significant opportunities for improvement via operational enhancements, market repositioning or redevelopment. In other words, value-add properties are those that have some income but are not yet at their maximum income potential.

The basic strategy behind value-add real estate investments is to increase the income of a property while the total value of the property appreciates simultaneously.

#### VALUE-ADD STRATEGIES

Now, taking a closer look at strategies within the field of value-add real estate investing, here are three common strategies to consider:

- Operational value investing
- Renovation or physical value investing
- Location or reposition value investing
- 1. Operational Value

• The operational value strategy involves investing in CRE — whether through individual properties or a portfolio — that may derive and provide value from improvements in operations.

• Improvements in operations can take many forms, but one readily available example can be found in improvements for energy efficiency. For example, replacing traditional light bulbs with LED lights can save thousands of dollars in operational costs, making the property more efficient.

#### 2. Renovation or Physical Value

• When you invest in a commercial property or portfolio that presents the potential for appreciation via renovations or similar physical improvements, you are participating in a renovation or physical value-add investment strategy.

• For example, if you purchase an office building that has little in the way of common areas, gyms, dining options and similar amenities, you can add value by adding these features to increase occupancy. That, in turn, creates the potential to increase cash flow.

#### 3. Location or Reposition Value

• The location or reposition value strategy is a method of value-add investing that relies on properties' physical locations or potential to change functions. ROI depends on the inherent value of a prime location or the value added by repositioning a building to occupy a more valuable function.

• For instance, you might add significant value by converting a low-traffic retail center



into a high-occupancy office park. Alternatively, you might derive value from purchasing an empty or low-occupancy property that is located in an area that is quickly developing or undergoing gentrification.

#### VALUE-ADD INVESTMENT EXAMPLE

• We see enormous potential in value-add real estate. That is why we have invested heavily using a value-add investment strategy. Over time, we have acquired a portfolio of real estate properties that offered the perfect blend of potential and current income.

#### HOW DOES VALUE-ADD ROI WORK?

• There is no doubt that value-add CRE investing presents some risks, which we have outlined in detail above, but there is also the potential reward to consider. The opportunity to re-lease, reposition, redevelop and otherwise improve these properties presents an expansive potential for ROI.

• Particularly, when executed correctly, value-add investment strategies present opportunity for income growth through improvements, capital appreciation and, ultimately, increased cash flow and/or dividend payouts to investors.

### Epidemic of Obesity and Metabolic Associated Fatty Liver Disease

There is worldwide increase in the prevalence of obesity which is defined by body mass index (BMI) > 30. It is estimated that about 3.12 billion people (39% of the global population) are obese. Obesity rates are also trending up in United States. At present more than 40% of U.S. population (135 million) is obese and if this trend continues, nearly half of Americans (168 million) will be obese by 2030. Worldwide prevalence of metabolic associated fatty liver disease (MAFLD) is 25%, however it doubles (50%) in patients with type 2 diabetes. MAFLD is linked to obesity and metabolic syndrome which include insulin resistance, diabetes, hyperlipidemia, hypertension and increased waist circumference. There is increase in inflammatory markers such as CRP, IL 6, TNF alpha in patients with MAFLD. These inflammatory markers result in dysfunctional adipose tissue in liver, heart and kidneys causing steatohepatitis (SH), cardiovascular disease and chronic kidney disease. Cardiovascular disease is the most common cause of mortality in patients with MAFLD followed by cirrhosis and liver cancer. Sedentary lifestyle, high-calorie diet, high fructose intake along with several genes are risk factors for MAFLD. Intestinal dysbiosis also plays a role in production of secondary bile acids which is toxic to hepatocytes causing increased collagen matrix, hepatic fibrosis and cirrhosis. MAFLD causes SH which results in hepatic fibrosis leading to cirrhosis, portal hypertension, liver failure and liver cancer. Liver biopsy is the gold standard to diagnose MAFLD and SH. However, several non-invasive biomarkers and imaging modalities are available to diagnose SH, fibrosis, and cirrhosis. FibroScan (Transient Elastography) is a noninvasive modality which can measure hepatic steatosis and fibrosis over an area estimated to be 100 times greater than liver biopsy. Sensitivity of FibroScan is 91%, specificity 92%. Goal of treatment in MAFLD include reversal of SH and to prevent progression to cirrhosis. The mainstay of therapy is lifestyle modification which include weight loss, calories restriction, increase physical activity, avoidance of high fructose containing food and low-fat diet. At the present time there is no FDA approved treatment to treat MAFLD, however multiple target molecules are being studied in phase 3 clinical trials. There are multiple FDA approved weight loss drugs available to treat obesity with positive impact on decreasing SH and reversal of fibrosis. They include GLP 1 agonist, GLP 1 in combination with GIP agonist which results in 25-30% weight loss and 10 % reduction of liver for fat content. Weight loss surgery (sleeve gastrectomy and Roux-en-Y gastric bypass surgery) can be considered in morbidly obese individuals with MAFLD meeting the criteria of surgery according to the BMI classification. At the present time there is no screening guidelines for MAFLD in general population, however it is recommended to screen high risk individuals such as patients with type 2 diabetes and obesity. In summary epidemic of obesity and MAFLD poses great challenge to worldwide medical community. Multidisciplinary approach is needed to find and treat these patients with long-term follow-up to prevent complications.
