August newsletter theme is APPNA charity work, but I want to begin with an important news regarding APPNA Canada. APPNA has registered as a branch in Canada as **APPNA Canada**.

APPNA Canada had its first inaugural annual meeting in Calgary, and it was a very successful meeting. The host committee in Calgary -Drs. Tariq Awan, Amir Aslam, Saad Yasin, Tehmina Munaf, Nusrat Asif and others helped organize this meeting and made it

a resounding success. The CME arranged by Dr Sara Makhdoom was very comprehensive and well attended Appna Canada helped form a new APPNA Chapter in British Columbia thanks to efforts of Drs Jamil Akhtar, Natasha Mirza and Salman Subzwari.

The crown jewel charity project of APPNA and SWDRC in my point of view is the APPNA Cornea project spearheaded by Dr. Fawad Zafar in which we have donated 7000 corneas for transplant in Pakistan and Afghanistan using a vast network of 32 centers across two countries. An online donation campaign raised \$ 100 K towards this project as well as a big donation from the Aisha Zafar family.

Clean water projects have been ongoing in association with Qatra fund and many solar powered water wells, and filtration plants have been established to provide clean water supply to the needy population. An 8 Km water pipeline with underground water storage tanks was also developed.

Ramadan food drive Telethon raised \$100 k to provide free food during Sehri and Iftar and thousands of food packages were distributed with help of different NGOs in Pakistan.

Aisha Zafar memorial project has been working on establishing 10 beds in an emergency room at Children's Hospital Multan where thousands of children are treated yearly.

APPNA has always been in forefront where ever calamity hits and recently sanctioned aid to Flood victims of Bangladesh to establish medical camps in Bangladesh.

Dr Sajid Chaudry and the entire SWDRC team has done a wonderful job as always and I thank Dr Sajid Chaudry for his humanitarian services and keeping the APPNA charity work going.

I also want to thank Dr Tariq bin Sagheer and Qatra fund team in helping with clean water projects in Pakistan.



Social Welfare and Disaster Relief Committee Chair Report



Dear APPNA Members.

APPNA Ramzan food drive in March helped thousands of deserving families across Pakistan and USA.

Over \$100k worth food including ration packs and hot meals for iftar and Sahri were provided in collaboration with our partner organizations in various areas of Pakistan and USA in collaboration with our partner organizations including Saylani Welfare Trust, Custom Healthcare Society, CDRS and ICNA Relief USA.

A fundraiser telethon was arranged in April 2024 to raise funds for our ongoing projects including Cornea Transplant project and Clean water supply project. With generous contributions from our donors, 100k was collected during the telethon.

In the memory of a longtime volunteer, chair and donor of APPNA SWDRC, APPNA Dr. Aisha Zafar Memorial project has been initiated to establish 10 beds bay at ER Children hospital Multan in collaboration with Childlife Foundation. It will serve to provide emergency healthcare to 15 thousand children per year of South Punjab.

APPNA Cornea Transplant project, starting in 2017 to date over 7000 persons have received cornea transplant through this project at 32 centers across Pakistan as well as Afghanistan.

APPNA clean water project, starting in 2015 to date installed 10 solar powered water filtration plants, 30 brick water wells, 165 water hand pumps and an 8 KM water pipeline with 3 underground tanks (each tank has a capacity of 10,000 gallons) in various areas across Pakistan including water deprived areas of Thar and Choolistan.


