Our volunteers help and guide young physicians via in person or seminar in US and in Pakistan our commitment knows no bounds of race religion ethnicity or geography. We're not just practitioners; we're architects of hope, bridging cultures and languages with empathy. From the first batch of our oldest institutes to the newest medical graduates of over 20 medical colleges, we're a family. Our bonds go beyond time zones, echoing through virtual conferences and late-night calls. We're parents, dreamers, and healers, woven together by purpose. APPNA isn't just an acronym; it's a symphony of

healing. So, let's raise our stethoscopes, our hearts, and our spirits. Let's be the change we wish to see. Because when we stand together, mountains bow, and miracles unfold.

Among many achievements and progress APPNA is making every year I wanted to highlight few dear to me which will make APPNA stronger and last longer:

APPNA Scholarship Endowment and Young Physicians Guidance Program has been making a significant impact since their inception. Let me share some details: because of these two programs we have recruited record number of younger first-time members to help us built on these volunteer services. Today APPNA membership is all time high.

- o Scholership program begans with an anonymous donor's generous contribution of ONE MILLION DOLLARS.
- o Encouraged by this initial investment, alumni members rallied to raise additional matching funds.
- o Currently, the endowment stands at an impressive over 6 million dollars.
- o We invite non-participating alumni to contribute to this worthy program.
- o By supporting these scholarships, you're not just donating; you're making a difference in the lives of aspiring physicians.
- o Visit APPNA's website to donate online or download the pledge form for payment by check or credit card.

Another flag ship project of APPNA to help YP is:

Young Physicians Committee's (YPC) Preceptors and Observer ship Program.

Last year, APPNA successfully placed over 200 Pakistani students for their US based rotations, and this year, our goal is to be able to accommodate around 400. On average, we receive more than 600 applications per year, and unfortunately, we do not have enough preceptors to accommodate everyone.

This year APPNA signed a MoU with USAID to be the primary partner in collaboration for health and education in Pakistan.

APPNA worked with PMDC to enable process for APPNA members to be eligible for PMDC certificates if they are board certified in USA and Canada and they want a PMDC certificate to work in Pakistan.

Treasurer's Message



As a treasurer of my beloved organization APPNA, my goal is to ensure compliance with regulations, transparency, accountability, and financial sustainability. After taking the office, we realized that APPNA was not in compliance with IRS rules and regulations in terms of accounting and tax filing from last few years. In mid February, our non-profit 501c3b status was retroactively revoked by IRS. We hired and actively worked with a national level firm with expertise in tax filing for non-profit organizations. All necessary data from the past was expeditiously gathered and tax documents (990 Forms) were filed. With help of few local area members, a meeting was held with Illinois Secretary of State's Office to help expedite the

reinstatement process. I am glad to inform that IRS has reinstated APPNA non-profit 501c3 status. Congratulations to our entire membership.

Keeping in mind the mission of APPNA as a philanthropist, medical education, and social welfare organization, we prepared 2024 budget. The budget was unanimously approved by the finance committee, board of directors and then the council. All meetings (including Strategy, International, Spring, and Summer) have been financially productive. We also reviewed our investment funds. Adjustments were made as necessary so as to maximize the profit gains. Currently, Stephens Inc. and Arch Global are handlings our investment funds. APPNA investment funds are over 8M now.

As a chair of Finance Committee, we held multiple zoom meetings. APPNA financial policy has been revised. It was last updated in 2021. A check-list has been created for different parties involved in finance and compliance management. The revised policy has recently been approved by the APPNA council, and is in-effect now. APPNA had lost its accounting firm during the COVID-19 era. In order to streamline our bookkeeping and accounting needs for the future, we interviewed multiple firms. After approval from APPNA board of directors, we have hired a CPA firm for our bookkeeping, accounting and tax filing needs. We strongly believe newly-hired CPA firm and our revised Financial Policy will help APPNA stay on tract as IRS compliant non-profit organization in the future.

Another important goal is transparency and keeping our membership informed. A 'Treasurer Reports' section has been added at APPNA website (www.appna.org). Once a member log-in, the section is the right lower hand side. All current and past few years meeting revenues as well as quarterly Financial reports have been added for member's review. APPNA Financial Policy has also been included.

In the end, I am thankful to APPNA membership for giving me this opportunity to serve as a treasurer.

Long Live APPNA- as a regulatory compliant and financially stable non-profit organization for years to come!!

Dear APPNA Colleagues, Family, and Friends,

The APPNA 2024 strategic planning meeting was held from January 25th through the 29th aboard the Royal Caribbean Radiance of the Seas cruise departing from Tampa, Florida bound for Cozumel, Mexico.

Thanks to President 2024, Dr. Asif Mohiuddin's forward thinking leadership, this meeting was a historic milestone for APPNA as this was the first

major meeting chaired and organized by North American and Caribbean Alumni. The goal was to formulate executable solutions, goals, and objectives for the upcoming year and beyond, that were based upon "SWOT" modeled analysis.

We were privileged to capitalize on the expertise of a diverse group of participants, including five past presidents (Drs. Arif Muslim, Manzoor Tariq, Mubashar, Rana, Sajid Chaudry, and Haroon Durrani), the President Elect (Dr. Humeraa Qamar), current and prior members of the Board of Directors (Drs. Rooh Afza Afridi, Sajid Mehmood, Muhammad Sanaullah, and Irfan Aslam), and Council, multiple committee chairs, and even "first timers." Our intense discourse and brainstorming extended beyond the regular scheduled sessions into midnight debates.

The meeting focused on three themes: (1) expanding APPNA's revenue stream by focusing on improving and streamlining member services and securing grants and sponsorships; (2) coordinating APPNA's education programs and leveraging the specialty expertise of our physicians; and (3) accelerating membership growth, by focusing on the recruitment of physicians-in-training and young physicians, and by streamlining the election process. Each session was led by a group of panelists, who provided an overview of the





All participants expressed their genuine concern that the meeting should conclude with specific actionable recommendations and plans, rather than leave with lofty ideals and no follow through. Therefore, we held focused add-on sessions to formulate a consensus-approved action item list (see below) pertaining to the above three subjects. We will update the membership of the progress of such actionable items at the national APPNA meetings and via email as needed. Key ad hoc committees were formed, including a Sponsorship Committee, to work with various Pharmaceutical and institutional sponsors and the American College of Medicine of APPNA committee, to coordinate the activities of RESA, YPN and Merit.

We thank all of the APPNA members who took time from their busy schedules to focus on the issues of the day affecting APPNA. We especially appreciate the cooperation displayed between President Dr. Asif Mohiuddin and President-Elect Dr. Humeraa Qamar during the Strategic Meeting to move this consensus-based agenda forward. It is our hope that having North American and Caribbean alumni of APPNA involved in this process added a novel approach to this annual meeting. Together, with the invaluable contributions, experience, and support of our colleagues from all chapters and alumni, we all hope to deliver an even better APPNA for all.

As always, we would like to thank Tipu and Laiq for their important logistical support for the meeting.



APPNA Young Physicians Committee



It is humbling to contribute to the next edition of the APPNA publication and talk about our collective organizational brilliance. All the APPNA committees are excellent examples of how different members bring in their contributions to achieve something collectively that is much larger than what could be achieved by individual endeavors. As a chair of the Committee on Young Physicians (YPC), I have witnessed this phenomenon repeatedly.

The goal of the APPNA YPC is to assist young physicians of Pakistani descent in navigating the complex process of obtaining US residency and fellowship positions. In addition to this; YPC have added some additional sub committees to focus on local US based audience specifically high school and college students

seeking admission into Medical Schools. YPC has also established "Early Careerist Subcommittee" that will focus on helping the residents, fellows and recent graduates with job placement, setting up of private

practices, financial awareness and visa issues.

One of the most important activity YPC team conducts are the regular monthly webinars and workshops for the applicants to guide our young physicians in every aspect of their journey to becoming competitive candidates for the training spots in the US. This year in 2024, YPC conducted numerous webinars with a large audience and panelists answering queries of young physicians as they navigated through the match process. More webinars are planned in the future to continue to help young physicians as they start their careers in US. In past several years, YPC mentors conducted mock interviews for over 800 residency applicants; and we strive to continue this task this year also!

APPNA YPC also organized the annual YPC seminar at the APPNA Summer Meeting in Maryland. We hosted a distinguished panel of program directors from different residency and fellowship programs. A poster competition was followed eminar. APPNA YPC poster competition in the Summer meeting received more then 55 outstanding abstract and oral presentations at the meeting. Research travel award was granted to top 12 candidates and we will continue annual poster competition at the nest APPNA summer meeting!

To achieve collective brilliance, we must recognize that everyone has something valuable to contribute. We need to listen to each other and respect each other's ideas. 2023 started with this very realization of mutual respect and bringing everyone together to reach new milestones and the collaboration continued in 2024 and is ongoing. We worked with all our component societies and affiliate organizations to create a highly accomplished group of mentors that are helping our young physicians every day through our Facebook portal and other mentorship social media groups. We saw a sizable

increase in the number of young Pakistani physicians who were matched for training spots in the US in 2023.



We extended free membership of APPNA to all the applicants and saw a sizeable increase in the members. APPNA YouTube channel viewership is continually increasing due to the high quality content being provided by

the YPC team! to increase our combined subscriber base and public views to monetize the channel. In addition, the APPNA YPC Facebook group continue to grow and have reached close to 20,000 members. We also have started multiple WhatsApp groups for mentorship and visa guidance.

The APPNA YPC Observership subcommittee have successfully placed more than 300 students this year for their clinical rotation. We connected all applicants with their assigned YPC preceptors for gaining US clinical experience, through a rigorous process and accepting applications via APNA YPC forum.

To help our medical students from Pakistan more competitive for the training spots in US, APPNA YPC has created a mentorship subcommittee of leaders from undergraduate medical education, faculty, fellows and residents to provide one to one mentorship sessions to the students. This mentorship program will greatly help the students to work with their mentors on building stronger CV, and participate on mock interviews to better prepare for the match cycle.

APPNA YPC is working with different chapters to organize orientation seminars and boot camps for incoming interns. APPNA YPC will organize its multiple in person seminars at annual APPNA Meetings. We have hosted the YPC inperson seminars at all APPNA meetings of 2024.

APPNA YPC loan subcommittee is working closely with the APPNA Foundation and leadership and to reactivate and initiate the interest free loan program for young physicians. An Initial loan program of \$40,000 is already approved and 10 cnadiates will be provided with interest free loan this year.

APPNA South Texas Chapter has started APPNA STC House in Houston area that is providing subsidized fully furnished accommodation to Pakistani medical students graduates that are in US temporarily for their exams and rotations.



We had a great start of the year and we are certain that the exemplary and selfless team members of YPC will carry out all these activities that will greatly benefit the future generation of Pakistani physicians in the US. I appreciate and thank APPNA President Dr. Asif Mohiuddin for his vison and support, and APPNA BODs for their continued help and dedication!








The Quiet Gardener: A Tribute to Tetsuo Hiramoto

I first met Mr. Tetsuo Hiramoto in 1980 when I hired him to landscape my newly built home. He came highly recommended by everyone I consulted. He was a frail, short man, perhaps in his eighties, though I never asked his age.

He arrived in his bright red Ambassador pickup truck, loaded with everything that was needed for the job. A young man drove the truck, but without helping the old man unload, he sat down on the edge of my neighbor's lawn, smoking a cigarette, indifferent to Tetsuo's efforts. I couldn't offer any help either due to my physical limitations. Tetsuo singlehandedly transformed my garden, creating a beautiful landscape in a few days.


Tetsuo had hired the young man to drive his truck because he could not renew his driver's license due to cataracts in both eyes, When I offered to help arrange cataract surgery to restore his vision, he politely declined, saying, "Doctor, God gave me my eyesight to observe and marvel at His creations. Now He is taking it away, and that is His will. I am comfortable with it."

Tetsuo spent time in internment camps, or "wartime relocation centers," as they were euphemistically called, along with more than 127,000 other Japanese Americans during World War II, Despite this injustice and financial hardships he and his family had faced,

he never spoke about that interment, even when I shared my own experience as a refugee. He chose not to marry, living in the annex of her sister's house, and devoted his life to landscaping to "stay close to nature." He loved to write poetry, and I transcribed his poems, had them beautifully bound, and presented them to him.

I used to sometimes visit him during the winter months when I often found him busy crafting wooden fixtures used in Japanese style gardens for his summer jobs. Tetsuo passed away peacefully at well over 90 years of age. After a life well-lived, Tetsuo's spirit lives on in every flower that blooms in every garden he touched (Figures 1 and 2)

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



Electric & Magnetic Brain Stimulation: Revolutionizing Neurological Treatment

Overview: Electric and magnetic brain stimulation technologies represent cutting-edge advancements in neuromodulation. These innovations focus on restoring brain function in patients suffering from neurological disorders, including Parkinson's disease, epilepsy, stroke, and neurodegenerative diseases.

Key Technologies:


- Magnetic Brain Stimulator: This device, covered under USPTO Patent US10207123-A1, utilizes a skull-implanted magnetic assembly to generate a static magnetic field. This field penetrates the scalp, reaching the cortex, where it induces action potentials in cortical neurons. Technology has been shown to improve brain function in conditions such as depression, epilepsy, and stroke.
- Electric Brain Stimulator: Under USPTO Patent US10780264-B2, this device applies repeated electric stimulation to specific brain areas, aiding in the treatment of epilepsy, stroke, neurodegenerative diseases, and more. The stimulation parameters typically include 25-60 Hz biphasic constant current stimuli with an intensity ranging from 1 to 15 mA.

Applications: Restoring human brain function: Magnetic and electric stimulation aids in restoring function by stimulating latent brain areas. Offers promising treatments for conditions like depression, PTSD, epilepsy, stroke, neurodegenerative diseases, and anxiety disorders.

Recognition: Dr. Imran Alam was honored with the prestigious CNS (Congress of Neurological Surgeons) Recognition for Innovation in 2021 for his groundbreaking work on the Magnetic Brain Stimulator, marking a significant milestone in the field of neuromodulation.

Market Potential: The brain stimulation devices market was valued at USD 1.1 billion in 2021 and is expected to reach USD 4.0 billion by 2030, growing at a CAGR of 14.1%. The demand for minimally invasive surgical procedures, combined with a rising geriatric population, is driving market growth.

Nadeem Throws Gold: From Village Fields to Olympic Glory

In the early evening of August 9th, 27-year-old Arshad Nadeem, one of seven Pakistani athletes in the 2024 Paris Olympic Games, lurched forward for his second attempt in the javelin throw after a disappointing first launch. Nadeem's javelin soared to a monstrous 92.97 meters, setting a new personal best, defeating defending champion close rival and friend, Indian athlete Neeraj Chopra, and most notably, shattering the standing 16-year-old Olympic record. His feat brought the Stade de France stadium to its feet in roaring applause. This moment of exuberant celebration paled only in comparison to the joy that pulsed throughout Pakistan, especially in the small Punjabi village of Mian Channu, where Nadeem's journey to Olympic glory first began – bringing hope to a nation that hadn't seen gold in 40 years.

The 2024 Paris Games broke 125 Olympic records thanks to unprecedented nutrition, training, and scientific advances. However, Nadeem, one of eight siblings and the son of a construction worker, had little access to these luxuries - fashioning his own javelins out of bamboo and iron tips, practicing in extreme heat and unreliable facilities, and relying on village crowdfunding for competition expenses. Further,

the biomechanical demands of javelin throws over 85 meters are immense, requiring the precise coordination of multiple muscle groups and spinal mobility. Javelins can reach speeds of up to 70mph, with athletes at times transmitting hundreds of pounds of force in a split second. The precision and coordination required to direct such formidable force is a testament to the magnificence of peak human athleticism. Despite such challenges, Nadeem's dedication led him to set personal bests throughout a decade of international competition.

Nadeem now leverages his prominence to support the establishment of a women's university and sports academy in Mian Channu. His historic victory will continue to inspire millions and draw attention to the untapped potential for Pakistani excellence beyond traditional cricket and field hockey avenues.



For those of us with Pakistani roots, Arshad Nadeem's success is a powerful embodiment of the American dream – this time realized on Pakistani soil – and a poignant reminder that Pakistan's brightest days are still ahead.





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
